According to the Kaiser Family Foundation survey in the year 2008-2009 of 2002 adolescents with the average ages from 8 to 18 in the US. The survey shows on average teenagers spent 10 hours and 45 minutes a day watching TV, playing games, visiting on social media webpages, (Facebook, Twitter) and talk on the phone, etc. On the average, they've spent 75 hours and 15 minutes weekly on the activities that are not very useful in for their lives.

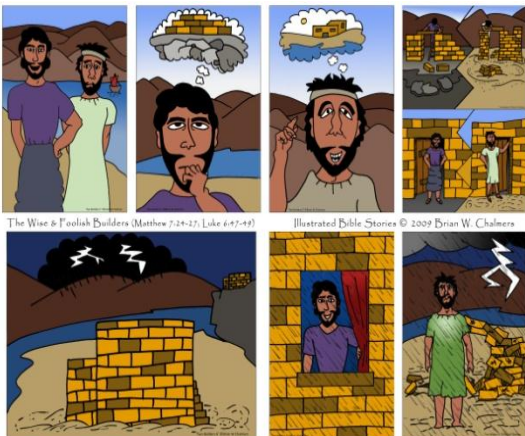

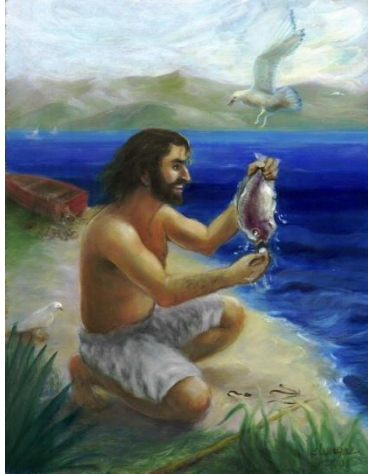

### CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

**2247** "Honor your father and your mother" (*Deut* 5:16; *Mk* 7:10).

**2248** According to the fourth commandment, God has willed that, after him, we should honor our parents and those whom he has vested with authority for our good.

**2249** The conjugal community is established upon the covenant and consent of the spouses. Marriage and family are ordered to the good of the spouses, to the procreation and the education of children.

**2250** "The well-being of the individual person and of both human and Christian society is closely bound up with the healthy state of conjugal and family life" (*GS* 47 § 1).

**2251** Children owe their parents respect, gratitude, just obedience, and assistance. Filial respect fosters harmony in all of family life.

**2252** Parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children in the faith, prayer, and all the virtues. They have the duty to provide as far as possible for the physical and spiritual needs of their children.

**2253** Parents should respect and encourage their children's vocations. They should remember and teach that the first calling of the Christian is to follow Jesus.

**2254** Public authority is obliged to respect the fundamental rights of the human person and the conditions for the exercise of his freedom.

**2255** It is the duty of citizens to work with civil authority for building up society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity, and freedom.

**2256** Citizens are obliged in conscience not to follow the directives of civil authorities when they are contrary to the demands of the moral order. "We must obey God rather than men" (*Acts 5:29*).

**2257** Every society's judgments and conduct reflect a vision of man and his destiny. Without the light the Gospel sheds on God and man, societies easily become totalitarian.

Again he left the district of Tyre and went by way of Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, into the district of the Decapolis. And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!" (means "Be opened!"). And (immediately) the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly. He ordered them not to tell anyone. But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it. They were exceedingly astonished and they said, "He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and mute speak." (Mk 7:31 – 36)

## Kiến Thức Liên Quan/Fact Finding

A Brief Summary of Estimates for the Size of the Deaf Population in the USA Based on Available Federal Data and Published Research: (<http://research.gallaudet.edu/Demographics/deaf-US.php>)

- About 2 to 4 of every 1,000 people in the United States are "functionally deaf," though more than half became deaf relatively late in life; fewer than 1 out of every 1,000 people in the United States became deaf before 18 years of age.
- However, if people with a severe hearing impairment are included with those who are deaf, then the number is 4 to 10 times higher. That is, anywhere from 9 to 22 out of every 1,000 people have a severe hearing impairment or are deaf. Again, at least half of these people reported their hearing loss after 64 years of age.
- Finally, if everyone who has any kind of "trouble" with





their hearing is included then anywhere from 37 to 140 out of every 1,000 people in the United States have some kind of hearing loss, with a large share being at least 65 years old.

As a Catholic, what do we do after listening the Word of God weekly?

Anyone who listens to the Word of God can and must speak and transmit it to others, to those who have never heard it, or who have forgotten it and buried under the thorny troubles and deceptions of the world (cf. Mt 13: 22).

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## Keeping Clean – Xin Được Trong Sạch

<sup>12</sup> While He was in one of the cities, behold, there *was* a man <sup>[a]</sup>covered with leprosy; and when he saw Jesus, he fell on his face and implored Him, saying, “Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean.” <sup>13</sup> And He stretched out His hand and touched him, saying, “I am willing; be cleansed.” And immediately the leprosy left him. <sup>14</sup> And He ordered him to tell no one, “But go and show yourself to the priest and make an offering for your cleansing, just as Moses commanded, as a testimony to them.” (Lk 5:12 –14)

### Kiến Thức Liên Quan/Fact Finding

In Jesus' time people who were *physically* unclean or who had a disease were considered to be *spiritually* unclean and could not participate in prayers or make sacrifices in the temple.

The people in Palestine were afraid of lepers because they could infect healthy people with their disease, and they despised the lepers as people who must have committed terrible secret sins.

Since leprosy shows in the skin, lepers could not hide their illness from the community, so they were shunned and forced to live apart, because other people were afraid they could catch their disease from them.

Though leprosy is not fatal, it can affect the voice and vision, as well as the skin, nose, toes, and fingers, and the leper's physical condition continued to deteriorate during his or her lifetime.

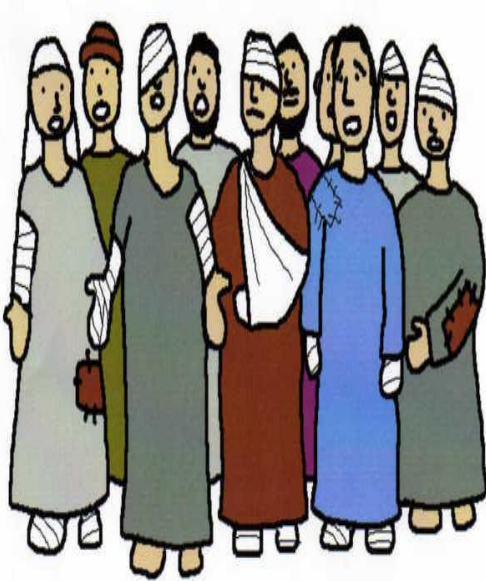
Because lepers could not participate in worship, most people believed that the disease was a punishment for earlier sins - not being able to worship God was the worst punishment people could imagine - so people thought the lepers must have done something horrible to be punished so severely for their whole lifetimes.

That Jesus could cure a disease that no one else could even stop in its course shows that he was a true worker of miracles. That Jesus cured so many people who were prevented from praying and worshipping shows that his mission on earth was to reconcile people to God.

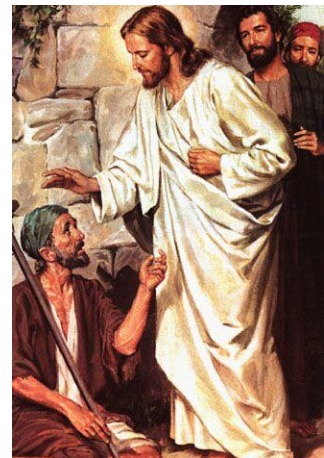

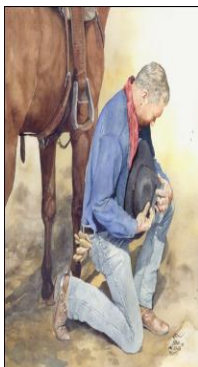

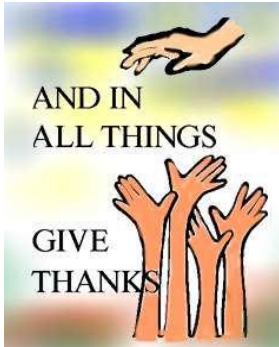

Being thankful is very important to God. There are many verses in the Bible that tell us to be thankful. When we have a thankful heart, we are showing God that we recognize where our blessings come from. It also reminds us to keep our focus on God and to give Him the glory for everything.



The most important thing to be thankful for is our salvation. Remember—we cannot save ourselves. Salvation is a free gift from God that we can receive because of what Jesus did for us on the cross. He died so that we might live. We can be forgiven of our sins and have eternal life.

Have you received this gift? If not, you can invite Christ into your heart today. And if you have received Jesus, remember to be thankful for all of his blessings.

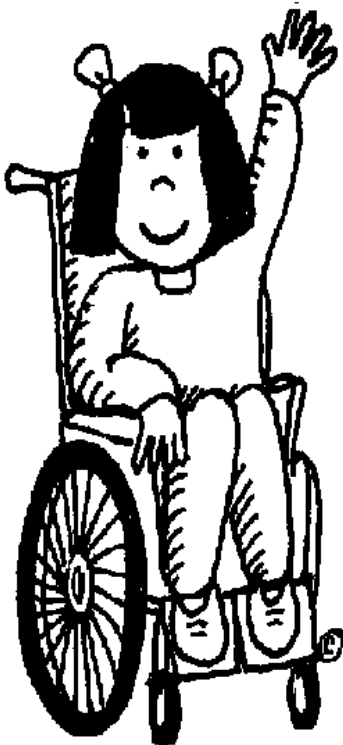

Tommy couldn't understand why he was going through this terrible sickness. "I am a prisoner, trapped in my own home!" He thought. Tommy had a rare disease that required him to stay inside of his house. If he were to go outside he would come into contact with many invisible germs that could get inside his body and make him more sick or even cause him to die. It was very difficult for Tommy to be inside of his house most of the day.

One afternoon, Tommy was standing next to the window and noticed a girl wheeling her wheelchair on the sidewalk. The child was probably close to Tommy's age, which was ten years old. The girl did not have any legs and seemed to struggle to push her wheelchair down the sidewalk. But the entire time she had a big smile on her face and when she saw Tommy standing by the window she waved to him. Tommy waved back. He couldn't understand why she was smiling so big or why she waved to him. The girl steered her wheelchair closer to the window.

She reached into a backpack she had connected to the chair and pulled out a writing tablet and a pen. She began writing questions

on the pad. “How come I never see you outside? How old are you? Can you come outside and play?” After reading the messages, Tommy started to get depressed because he knew there was no way for him to go outside. Tommy retrieved a tablet and responded back to the girl outside.

“I am 10 years old and I can’t come outside because I have a disease.” The little girl responded back with “That’s OK. I have a disease too. But someday I will have a new body without any diseases or any problems at all.” Tommy thought to himself, “What is this girl so happy about and what does she mean about getting a new body?”

From that point on, every day after school Angela (the girl in the wheelchair) would stop by to talk to Tommy. She learned about Tommy’s rare disease and began to communicate with him by writing notes on a tablet. Angela was always joyful, friendly, and she always had a smile on her face. Many times, Angela would tell Tommy about Jesus and how He changed her life. She told Tommy about having a new life and that someday when she died she would get a brand new body. Tommy accepted Christ as his savior one day while visiting with Angela.



God was using Angela despite her illness. Angela bought Tommy a Bible on his birthday. She gave him a guide he could use to find Bible verses and learn more about Jesus. Everyday at around 3:25 p.m. Tommy would walk over to the window to wait for his friend Angela. One day, Tommy went over by the window

and waited for Angela. He waited and waited, and there was no Angela. “Angela has not missed a visit for almost two years!” “Were could she be?” Another day went by and no Angela. Four days went by before Tommy heard anything about Angela. Finally on the last day, Tommy received a message from Angela’s Father. Angela had a severe infection and was hospitalized. Angela died while she was in the hospital. Tommy was very upset.

Tommy started to feel depressed again. As Tommy opened up his Bible that evening, he noticed a bookmark that Angela had given to him. On the bookmark was a Bible Verse Angela wrote for Tommy; “In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.” 1 Thessalonians 5:18. Instead of looking down, Tommy looked up. He was thankful for meeting Angela. He was thankful that Angela introduced him to Jesus Christ. Tommy knew that his illness would bring God glory just like it did with Angela.

- **Meaning:** It is the time for us to contemplate about the teaching of Jesus while he was living on earth.
- **Color:** green



#### 4. Lent Season

- **Time:** It begins on [Ash Wednesday](#) and, if the penitential days of [Good Friday](#) and [Holy Saturday](#) are included, lasts for forty days. The week before Easter is called the Holy Week.
- **Meaning:** Preparation for Easter. It is time for Christians to look back into their lives examining their sins and go to confession to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- **Color:** violet.

#### 5. Easter Season

- **Time:** varies from year to year, according to a lunar-calendar dating system. In the Roman Rite, the Easter season extends from the [Easter Vigil](#) through [Pentecost](#) Sunday.
- **Meaning:** Jesus Christ is Risen! Easter celebrates the resurrection of Jesus, the central feast of Christianity
- **Color:** white

### Summary

In the liturgical year, the Church unfolds the entire mystery of Christ. This mystery is so complex and rich in meaning that no one single prayer or liturgical celebration can ever express it adequately.

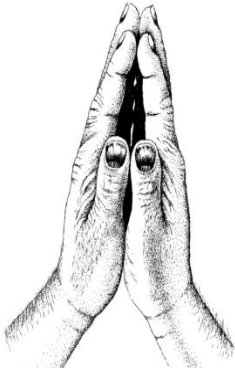
The liturgical year helps us to “walk around” the paschal mystery. During the course of a year, we view it from different angles, in different lights. Within the cycle of a year, the Church unfolds the whole mystery of Christ, from his incarnation and birth until his ascension, the day of Pentecost, and the expectation of his return in glory.

As we celebrate the mystery of Christ, we are not merely recalling the past events. When we celebrate in memory of Jesus, our liturgical remembering (anamnesis) makes the mystery present.

The liturgical year, with its various feasts and seasons, helps us to keep our hearts open *each day* to the voice of God in our lives and in our world.

# Readings in Mass

## Reading the Bible

*John 1:1* In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

## Studying Our Faith

### Sunday Mass

1. The **first reading** comes from the Old Testament (except for during Easter). The reading and the responsorial psalm are chosen so that they relate to the gospel reading.
  2. The **second reading** is from the New Testament, usually from one of the 13 Pauline epistles. They follow a continual system like the Gospels. The Letters of St. Paul and St. James are read during Ordinary time, while those of John and Peter are read during Christmas and Easter. They do not seem to fit in well with the gospel since they use their own system.
  3. For the **Gospel readings**, each year is dedicated to one of the synoptic gospels. The next year continues on in the Gospel reading cycle. The new lectionary year begins on the first Sunday of Advent.
    - Year A for Matthew
    - Year B for Mark
    - Year C for Luke
    - The gospel of John is read each year, primarily during Christmas, Lent and Easter.
- During Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter and solemnities, all three readings are chosen to reflect the liturgical season.
  - Every day during Easter season, the first reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles. The exact same readings are used each year.
  - Towards the end of the year, the readings come from the books of Revelation and Daniel, which fit well with the apocalyptic sermons from Luke.

### Daily Readings

1. The first reading can be taken from either Testament.
2. During Ordinary time, all four gospels are read using a semi-continual system. Mark weeks 1-9; Matthew 10-12; and Luke 22-34.

The New Testament readings give the substance of almost all the letters, but the Old Testament readings only show the important parts of each book. Almost all of the books are used except some prophets and the Song of Songs.

## Summary

When in celebrating the Liturgy of the Words, the church proclaims God's words in the Old and New Testament. Christ himself is the center and fullness of the whole of Scripture. Thus, the Scripture is the living water for those who seek life and salvation.

*Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness;*

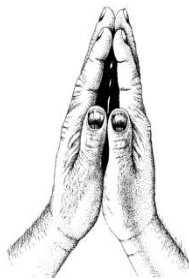

Each Sunday mass has three readings: the first from the Old Testament, the second from an Apostle (that is, either from a Letter or from the Book of Revelation, depending on the season), and the third from the gospels.

This arrangement brings out the unity of the Old and New Testaments and of the history of salvation, in which Christ is the central figure, commemorated in His paschal mystery.

- During the week, try to think about Jesus' message and act on it.

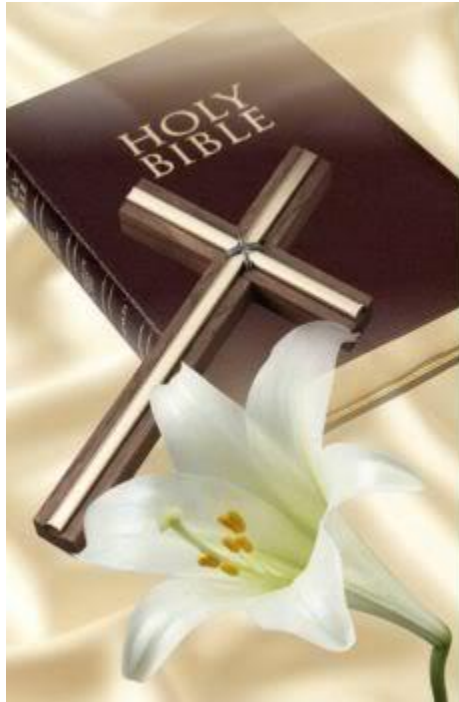

1. The new lectionary year begins on New Year's Day.
2. During Sunday mass, the first reading comes from the Old Testament.
3. The daily mass has three readings, just like the Sunday readings.



# Holy days of Obligation, Solemnities, Feast, Memorials

## Reading the Bible

*Luke 2:41-42* Now his parents went to Jerusalem every year at the feast of the passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up to Jerusalem after the custom of the feast

## Studying our Faith

### Solemnity

- Holy days of solemnity/obligation are celebrated to commemorate an event of utmost importance
- Holy days of solemnity normally has Vigil the night before the actual celebration
- Most of the Holy days of Solemnity are also Holy Day of Obligations, so the two terms are interchangeable. See Canon Law section below.

### Feast

- Feast days are days to commemorate and honor an important biblical figures
- Feast days does are not obligatory

### Memorial

- Memorial days are celebrate year round in honor of any figures that is lesser than the previous two categories

On December 13, 1991 the members of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops of the United States of American made the following general decree concerning holy days of obligation for Latin rite Catholics:

In addition to Sunday, the days to be observed **as holy days of obligation in the Latin Rite dioceses of the United States of America**, in conformity with canon 1246, are as follows:

**January 1**, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God  
**Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter**, the solemnity of the Ascension

**August 15**, the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary  
**November 1**, the solemnity of All Saints  
**December 8**, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception  
**December 25**, the solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ

Whenever January 1, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, or August 15, the solemnity of the Assumption, or November 1, the solemnity of All Saints, falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated.

**Canon Law 1247** On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are obliged to participate in the Mass.

## Summary

In the Third Commandment, God tells us to “Remember to keep holy the sabbath day.” For the Jews, the sabbath was Saturday; Catholics, however, transferred the sabbath to Sunday, the day of Jesus Christ’s resurrection from the dead. The Church tells us that we have an obligation to fulfill the Third Commandment by refraining from unnecessary work on Sunday and by participating in the Mass, our chief form of worship as Catholics.

### Private Worship Is Not Enough

From the earliest days of the Church, Christians have understood that being a Christian isn’t a private matter. We are called to be Catholics together; while we can and should engage in the private worship of God throughout the week, our primary form of worship is public and communal, which is why Sunday Mass is so important.

## Practicing our Faith

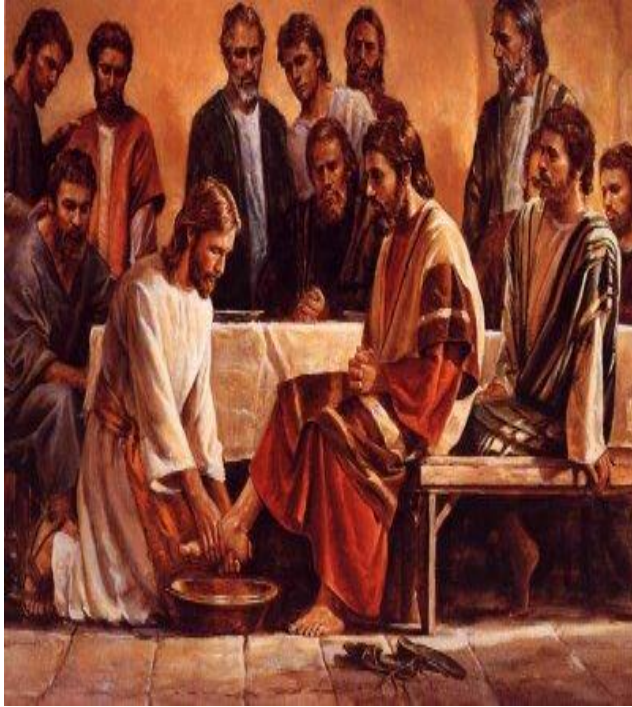

# Vestment and Colors of the Liturgical Year

## Reading the Bible



em."(Ga 13, 1,4-5, 12-15)

<sup>1</sup> Before the feast of Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to pass from this world to the Father. He loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end. ... <sup>4</sup> he rose from supper and took off his outer garments. He took a towel and tied it around his waist. <sup>5</sup> Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and dry them with the towel around his waist. .... <sup>12</sup> So when he had washed their feet (and) put his garments back on and reclined at table again, he said to them, "Do you realize what I have done for you?" <sup>13</sup> You call me 'teacher' and 'master,' and rightly so, for indeed I am. <sup>14</sup> If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet. <sup>15</sup> I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do (John 13, 1,4-5, 12-15)

## Studying Our Faith

1. "What do you call that thing that the priest is wearing?" This is a commonly asked question that Catholics ask because they do not know what to call the clothing that is being worn by the clergy.
2. The word "vestment" comes from the Latin. It simply means clothing. Now, it is generally used to represent the garments that are worn by the ministers of religion in the performance of their sacred duties.

3. Vestments are a sacramental. That means they are set apart and blessed by the Church to excite good thoughts and to increase devotion in those who see and those who use them. They are the uniform of the priest when he is "on duty," while he is exercising the functions of his ministry and using the sacred powers which he received at his ordination. The clothing that is worn by the priest while he is not "on duty," it is not called vestments.

4. The Mass vestments were originally ordinary garments of the ancient Roman world. While the fashions of dressing have changed with the passing centuries, the priest continued to wear at the altar the ancient Roman costume of his predecessors.

5. Thus, the priest, vested for mass, is a wonderful witness to the historical continuity of the Catholic Church with the primitive Church of Rome, founded by the Prince of the Apostles.

2) Các Màu Sắc của Phẩm Phục của các Linh Mục trong Thánh Lễ (the colors of the vestments of the Priests at Mass)

**a) Màu Trắng (white):** Chỉ sự trong sạch, thánh thiện, chiến thắng, vui mừng

*White signifies innocence and is used on the feasts of Our Blessed Lord, of the Blessed Virgin, and of some saints.*

*Red signifies love, and is used on the feasts of the Holy Ghost, and of martyrs*

*Green signifies hope, and is generally used on Sundays from Epiphany to Pentecost.*

**d) Tím (violet):** Chỉ sự thống hối, ăn năn nói lên sự hoán cải. Mùa vọng - Mùa chay - Lễ cầu hồn (ở Hoa Kỳ thay bằng màu trắng)

*Violet signifies penance, and is used in Lent and Advent.*

**e) Hồng (pink):** Chỉ niềm vui trước kỳ hạn thống hối. Chúa Nhật thứ 3 mùa vọng - Chúa nhật thứ 4 mùa chay

**f) Vàng (yellow):** Tăng phần long trọng

*Gold is often used for white on great feasts.*

**g) Đen (black):** Chỉ sự tang chế, cầu hồn, an táng (Old tradition. Được thay bằng màu Trắng)

*Black signifies sorrow, and is used on Good Friday and at Masses for the dead.*

# The Altar and Objects Needed For Mass

## Reading the Bible

**Luke 22: 7, 19, 20** <sup>7</sup> “Then came the day of Unleavened Bread on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed.” <sup>19</sup> “And he took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, “This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me.” <sup>20</sup> “In the same way, after the supper he took the cup, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you.

## Studying our Faith



### The things needed for Mass are:

- **ALTAR** - The central object of the Church. The table on which the offerings [the sacrifice] of the Mass are consecrated. An Altar with linen covers, candles, crucifix, altar stone, and Mass book
- **ALB**: the white robe that the priest and servers wear.
- **CINCTURE**: rope “belt” that is tied around the alb.
- **STOLE**: the thin “scarf-like” part of the priest’s vestment.

- **CHASUBLE:** the large colored garment worn by the priest over his alb. [the different colors are for the different “Seasons” of the Church’s year]
- **CORPORAL:** the square “place mat” placed on the Altar by the priest when preparing the gifts.
- **CHALICE:** a cup used for the distribution of the consecrated wine [“the Blood of Christ”].
- **CIBORIUM:** a plate or bowl used for the distribution of the communion bread [“the Body of Christ”].
- **PURIFICATOR:** a small white cloth used to wipe off the communion cups.
- **CRUETS:** small containers used for water and wine.
- **CARAFE** - Larger “pitchers” used to hold the water and wine.
- **SACRAMENTARY:** the big, red book used by the priest for the various prayers.
- **LECTIONARY:** the large book carried by the Lector used for the Scripture readings. This book is always on the pulpit/ambo.
- **PROCESSIONAL CROSS:** a cross or crucifix carried by the server in the procession in and out.
- **THURIBLE:** used for incense [looks like a decorated bowl on a long chain].

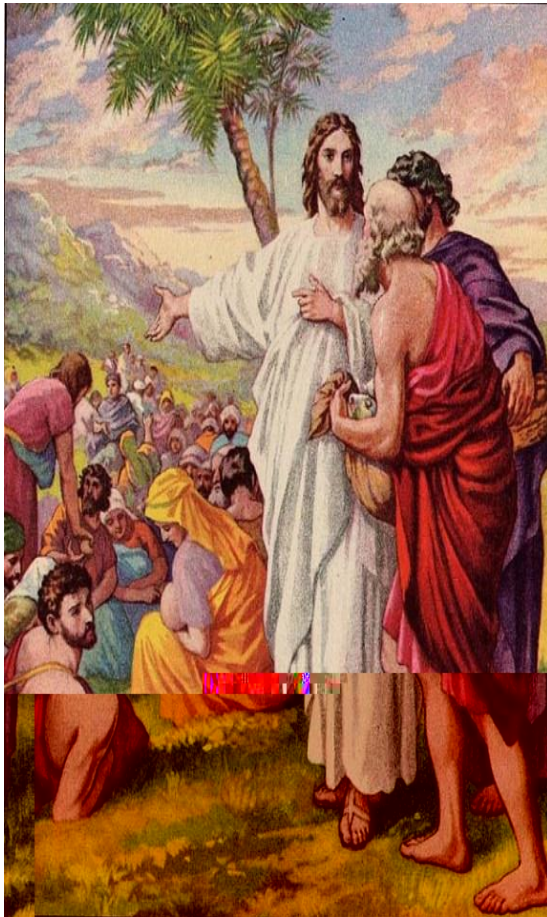

# Before and After Meals Prayers

## Fact Finding

Christians frequently pray before meals, giving thanks to God for the food we are about to eat. Pre-meal prayers can be a simple “thank-you” to God for the meal or lengthier prayers of thanksgiving for all of His provisions in our lives. In praying before meals, we are following the example of the Lord Jesus, whose prayers on several occasions are our model.



In the two instances where Jesus miraculously fed multitudes of people with a few loaves and fish, He “gave thanks” ([Matthew 14:19-21](#); [15:34-36](#)). In the first instance, He fed 5000 men, plus women and children, with five loaves of bread and two fish. In the second, He fed over 4000 with seven loaves and a few fish. At the Last Supper, Jesus again set the example of thanksgiving. When He passed the cup and the bread to His disciples, telling them to eat and drink these elements which were symbols of His body and blood, He gave thanks. When He appeared to the two men on the road to Emmaus after His resurrection, He stopped briefly to eat with them, and “took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them” ([Luke 24:30](#)).

The apostle Paul continued this example of praying before eating, as recorded in Acts 27. In this instance, Paul was on a ship with 276 other people when a hurricane battered the ship.

After fourteen days of not eating, Paul exhorted the sailors and other passengers to eat something in order to survive. He “took some bread and gave thanks to God in front of them all” ([Acts 27:35](#)). Even in spite of the danger and terrible circumstances, Paul paused to give thanks to God before the meal.

Praying before we eat with a thankful heart brings glory to God and centers our minds on His great love for His children and the blessings He bestows on those who belong to Him.

#### 3. Ending the day with night prayers

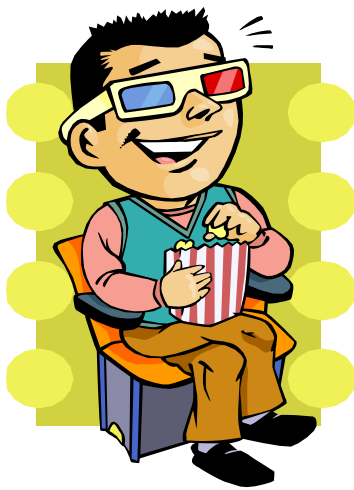
- a. The Eucharistic Day ends with spiritual flower bouquet and the offering of the night.

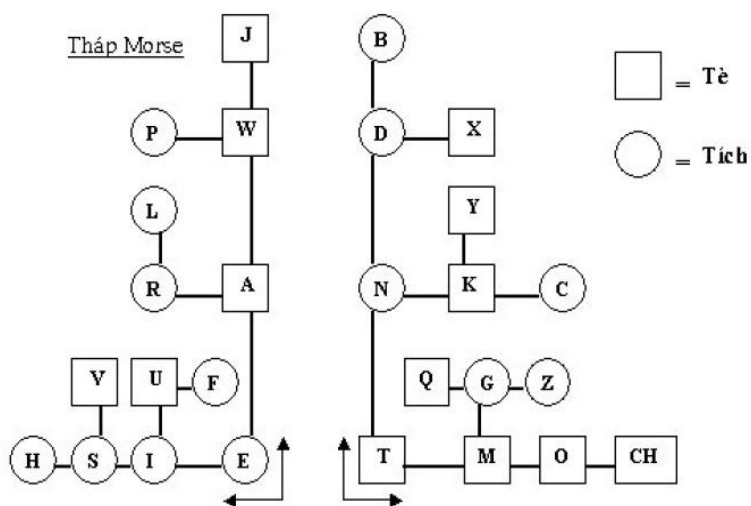

#### I. Tổng Quát Về Khen Thưởng

Trong các sinh hoạt của Thiếu Nhi Thánh Thể, khen thưởng là một cách giáo dục không những nên cao tinh thần đồng đội, mà còn làm phát triển khả năng của cá nhân. Vì thế, lễ nghi khen thưởng cũng mang các hình thức: Khen Thưởng Cá Nhân, Khen Thưởng Đội, Khen Thưởng Nhiều Đội ... Phong Trào Thiếu Nhi Thánh Thể dùng tua, cờ danh dự, bằng khen, kỷ vật, v.v... để khen thưởng.

#### II. Ý Nghĩa Màu Tua

Thiếu Nhi Thánh Thể dùng màu sắc của các Ngành để làm màu tua khen thưởng, và mỗi màu tua đều mang một ý nghĩa rõ rệt:

#### A. **Tua Màu Xanh Lá Cây:** (Phụng Vụ) – Spiritual

#### C. **Tua Màu Vàng:** (Học Tập) - Learning

Màu vàng là màu của Ngành Nghĩa, tượng trưng tinh thần đi gieo, luôn cố gắng trau dồi khả năng để ngày nay học tập, ngày mai giúp đời. Tua màu vàng dùng để khen thưởng những sinh hoạt học tập, báo thí, những nghệ thuật đặc sắc, độc đáo và phong phú; những kỹ thuật chuyên môn trong sa mạc như: thủ công lều trại, hoặc sáng chế những vật dụng hữu ích cho đời sống.

#### A. Khen Thưởng Cá Nhân: Individual

1. Khi nghe gọi tên, cá nhân mau mắn chỉnh tề lại y phục, chạy thẳng lên đứng thế nghiêm trước mặt vị chủ tọa và hàng quan khách cách ba bước, giơ tay chào hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách ( ).
2. Người được mời phát thưởng tiến đến trước mặt người được lãnh thưởng, phát thưởng hoặc gắn tua ( ).
3. Người phát thưởng bắt tay chúc mừng ( ).
4. Chờ người phát thưởng về chỗ rồi, cá nhân chào hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách.
5. Sau đó cá nhân tự động quay trở về chỗ của mình ( ).



6. Trưởng Trục bắt bài hát khen thưởng.

#### B. Khen Thưởng Nhiều Cá Nhân:

1. Khi nghe gọi tên, lần lượt từng cá nhân mau mắn chỉnh tề lại y phục, chạy lên đứng dàn hàng ngang nghiêm chỉnh trước mặt hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách cách ba bước. Người đứng đầu hàng phía trái hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách hô: “**Chuẩn bị chào ... Chào!**”. Chào hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách.
2. Vị chủ tọa có thể mời nhiều người ra phát thưởng hoặc trao tua cùng một lúc.
3. Phát thưởng xong, người phát thưởng bắt tay chúc

mừng ( ).

4. Chờ người phát thưởng về chỗ rồi, người đứng đầu hàng phía trái Trưởng và Quan Khách hô: “**Chuẩn bị chào ... Chào!**”. Chào hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách.

5. Sau đó, các cá nhân tự động di chuyển về vị trí đội của mình ( *khác*).

6. Trưởng Trục bắt bài hát khen thưởng.

### **C. Khen Thưởng Đội:**

1. Được lệnh lên lãnh thưởng, Đội Trưởng báo cho đội viên chỉnh tề y phục.

2. Đội Trưởng hô tên đội một lần: “**Seraphim**”, cả Đội đáp lại khẩu hiệu đội: “**Trong trắng!**”. Sau đó dùng cờ lệnh cho Đội quay bên phải, rồi dùng khẩu lệnh hô: “**Đàng trước ... Bước!**”.

3. Đội Trưởng dẫn Đội chạy vòng ra bên ngoài đội hình ngược chiều kim đồng hồ, đến sắp thành hàng ngang trước mặt hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách cách bốn bước, lấy vị trí của vị chủ tọa làm chuẩn đứng giữa.

4. Đội Trưởng so hàng đội, sau khi hô tên đội và cả Đội đáp lại khẩu hiệu đội, Đội Trưởng dùng cờ lệnh lần khẩu lệnh cho Đội quay mặt vào hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách: “**Bên trái ... Quay!**”, “**Chuẩn bị chào ... Chào!**”. Chờ hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách chào lại xong, rồi tất cả bỏ tay xuống.

5. Đội Trưởng tự động tiến lên trước mặt vị chủ tọa cách ba bước (*không chào*). Tay phải đưa thẳng cờ lên, rồi hạ nằm ngang vai về phía trước, hợp với thân mình một góc 90 độ, tay trái chuôi cán cờ sát nách, lòng bàn tay úp xuống đất.

6. Chờ người phát thưởng gắn tua trên cờ xong, thì đưa thẳng cờ lên rồi hạ xuống và chuyển cờ ngay sang tay trái để bắt tay người phát thưởng. ( *hen* ). Sau khi phát thưởng xong, Đội Trưởng tự động trở về vị trí đội.

7. Đội Trưởng ra lệnh cho Đội chào hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách: “Chuẩn bị chào ... Chào!”. Sau đó di chuyển Đội về vị trí bằng khẩu lệnh: “**Bên phải ... Quay!**”, “**Đàng trước ... Bước!**” (Nhớ chạy vòng sau lưng hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách ngược chiều kim đồng hồ).

8. Trưởng Trục bắt bài hát khen thưởng.

9. Về tới vị trí đội, Đội Trưởng dùng cờ lệnh so hàng và cho Đội quay về vị Trí đội hình.

#### D. Khen Thưởng Nhiều Đội:



1. Được lệnh lên lãnh tua/bằng khen, Đội Trưởng báo cho đội viên chỉnh tề y phục.

2. Đội Trưởng hô tên đội một lần: “**Seraphim**”, cả Đội đáp lại khẩu hiệu đội: “Trong trắng!”. Sau đó dùng cờ lệnh cho Đội quay phải, rồi dùng khẩu lệnh hô: “Đàng trước ... Bước!”.

3. Các Đội Trưởng lần lượt dẫn Đội chạy vòng ra bên ngoài đội hình ngược chiều kim đồng hồ, đến sắp thành nhiều hàng Trưởng và Quan

Khách, Đội đứng trước cách bốn bước, lấy vị trí của vị chủ tọa làm chuẩn đứng giữa.

4. Đội Trưởng so hàng đội, sau khi hô tên đội và cả Đội đáp lại khẩu hiệu đội, Đội Trưởng dùng cờ lệnh lần khẩu lệnh cho Đội quay mặt vào hàng Trưởng: “**Bên trái ... Quay!**”, và đứng nghiêm đôi lệnh.

5. Khi các Đội đã đầy đủ và nghiêm chỉnh trong hàng ngũ, Đội Trưởng Đội đứng hàng đầu ra lệnh cho các Đội chào hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách: “**Chuẩn bị chào ... Chào!**”. Chờ hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách chào lại xong, rồi tất cả bỏ tay xuống.

6. Các Đội Trưởng tự động tiến lên đứng dàn hàng ngang trước mặt vị chủ tọa cách ba bước (không chào).

7. Vị chủ tọa thể mời nhiều người ra gần tua và trao bằng khen thưởng cùng một lúc.

8. Các Đội Trưởng tay phải đưa thẳng cờ lên rồi hạ nằm ngang vai về phía trước, hợp với thân mình một góc 90 độ, tay trái cầm chuỗi cán sờ sát nách, lòng bàn tay úp xuống đất.

9. Chờ người phát thưởng gắn tua trên cờ xong, thì đưa thẳng cờ lên rồi hạ xuống và chuyển cờ ngay sang tay trái để bắt tay người phát thưởng.

. Sau khi phát thưởng xong, các Đội Trưởng tự động trở về vị trí đội ( ).

10. Đội Trưởng đứng hàng đầu ra lệnh cho các Đội: “**Chuẩn bị chào ... Chào!**”. Chờ hàng Trưởng và Quan Khách chào lại xong, rồi tất cả bỏ tay xuống. Sau đó, di chuyển Đội về vị trí bằng khẩu lệnh: “**Bên phải ...**

**Quay!**”, “**Đàng trước ... Bước!**”. Đội đứng hàng đầu chạy trước, các Đội khác lần lượt chạy tiếp theo sau vòng ra bên ngoài đội hình ngược chiều kim đồng hồ để về vị trí đội.


